SUBJECT: After Action Report, Period 1-30 April 1945.

TO : The Adjutant General, United States Army, Washington,
25, D.C. (Through Channels)

1. Combat activity was limited to approximately the first two weeks of the period after which the unit enjoyed a relatively quiet phase. During this phase maintenance of vehicles and repair of clothing and equipment was stressed. Enemy air activity during the early portion of the period was moderate. Again Company A supported Combat Command A, medically, and Company B supported Combat Command B of the Division. Company C still functioned as the Reserve Medical Company.
