AFTER ACTION REPORT PERIOD 1-30 NOVEMBER 1944

Operations for the Battalion were normal for the entire period. Company A in support of Combat Command A and Company B in support of Combat Command B moved in a northeasterly direction encountering stiff resistance. Six Hundred and Eighty Four (684) Battle casualties and Four Hundred and Fifty Eight (458) Trench Foot cases were evacuated by the two forward units. Vehicular losses were four (4) ambulances evacuated to fourth echelon maintenance. Replacement was made without delay. Personnel losses consisted of one man killed in action by fragmentation. Supply functions have remained normal and no difficulties were encountered.

Communication with forward units has been excellent. At times receivers and transmitters failed in operation. When this problem arose, radio maintenance crews were immediately dispatched from Headquarters and repairs made or sets exchanged.

Headquarters and Headquarters Company and Company C, this Battalion remained in the vicinity of Trains, Fourth Armored Division, for the entire period. The reserve unit operated a convalescent station, conserving a good portion of the Division manpower.
